Job Summary

Duties include the delivery of speech and language therapy assessments and interventions in the school ensuring that programmes are integral to the student's education and development. Support to be given across two local schools within the Cavendish group. Initially, 4 days at Gryphon School and 1 day at Hardwick House School.

Principal Responsibilities

Intervention / Therapy / Pupil Learning

- Provide speech and language therapy to pupils attending Gretton School.
- Plan, prepare, deliver and evaluate support programmes for pupils.
- Deliver programmes of therapy and pupils' individual needs.
- Delivery and assessment of pupil interventions in school and elsewhere as required.
- Provide speech and language therapy targets for integration into the curriculum as part of each pupil's IEP in consultation with parents and teaching staff.
- Assess, record and report on the development, progress and attainment of pupils.

Assessment and Reports

- Provide or contribute to oral and written assessments or reports.
- Provide progress reports for Annual Reviews.
- Maintain records of intervention.

Appraisal

- Participate in any arrangements for the appraisal of the therapist's performance as well as for other therapists.
- Maintain up to date continuing professional development (CPD) and participate in clinical and management supervision.
- Supervise students and therapy assistants if required.

Contributing to the life of the School

- Help to maintain wellbeing and positivity among the pupils and safeguard their health and safety both on the school premises and when engaged in other authorised school activities.
- Participate in regular staff and therapy team meetings.
